This conference is a not to be missed event that will focus and re-fire you, propelling you into your destiny as a leader.

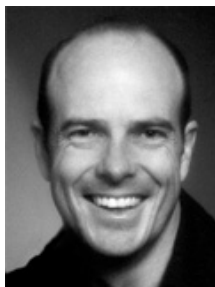

MOTIVATION

Motivation - what does it look like, how do we get it, how do we get it back? We all know when we have it and when we don't.

Motivation comes in many packages, but for Christians it comes primarily through Christ. Indeed the greatest motivation for us is God's love (2 Cor 5:14)

Motivation Defined

Motivation can be defined as that which initiates motion or that which induces a person to act. It is human energy - probably the most plentiful energy on the earth!

Many differing things motivate us. Here are just a few:

This list is in no particular order and is just the tip of the iceberg in the variety of sources of motivation.

What do Motivated People Look Like?

Motivated people are first and foremost, willing people.

A good example of a willing group of people can be seen when the children of Israel brought their offerings for the building of the tabernacle of the Lord (Exodus 35:4-36:7).

Here the people had to be restrained from bringing more, because they were so willing to give.

Why were the people so willing? The answer is simply that God and His work captivated the hearts of these people, and so they stopped grumbling, and instead, became willing, motivated people.

Motivated people want to get the job done. Their motivation encourages them into action. The stronger the motivation, the more sacrificial of time, money and energy they will be. In fact, highly motivated people are determined to get the job done, even in the face of strong opposition.

Traits of Motivated People:

- They lead a disciplined, godly life which seeks to put God and His will first.
- They set goals for their life and plan strategies to achieve them that they stick to (where possible) until the job gets done.
- They seek to excel in all they do.
- They do not wear themselves out and they are not lazy, because they have achieved a balance in life which enables them to live purposefully and productively.
- They don't neglect any area of their life, allowing time for their physical, emotional, intellectual, social and spiritual needs to be met.
- They are forgiving people.
- They are full of confidence in God and what He can do through them. Their confidence enables them to laugh at themselves when they get it wrong or when things go wrong. Their confidence in God gives them courage.
- They know that if they cannot believe in themselves then no one else will either.
- They have a sense of direction - even though they may not be visionaries.
- They are willing to stretch themselves to the limit in mind and body as they seek to fulfil the will of God.
- They are willing to step out in faith and take risks where necessary.
- They are capable of change and are versatile.
- They have an optimistic approach to life, believing that all problems are solvable in God.
- They are discouraged at times, but generally they are not depressed or down.
- They are humble - knowing that God deserves the glory for their success.
- They do not boast of their successes as they speak for themselves.
- They are patient - knowing that God always proves faithful and has a time for everything.
- They are good listeners and communicators.
- They are trustworthy.

Being motivated when we realise the privilege of the Gospel is much easier than when we live for nothing of value. Yet the devil tries to suck us dry of our motivation. I trust these reflections on motivation will help you stay motivated to what God has for you!
